School Uniform Reminder

Please remember that school uniform is an important part of our school identity. We have noticed an increase in the number of children who are in uniform that does not meet with school expectations. It is expected that pupils will wear...

Grey tailored shorts, trousers, skirt or grey/green pinafore dress.

Gold polo shirt – NOTE: These should be gold <u>not</u> pale or lemon yellow.

Green sweatshirt or fleece.

Black shoes (not trainers)

Green & white gingham dresses may be worn in the summer months.

Please note, Black trousers, black pinafores, black skirts and black shorts are <u>not</u> part of our uniform. We do have a large amount of secondhand uniform, too much to display. If you're looking for something, please let the office know.

Attendance Matters! So far so good! But did you know...

Arriving at school on time and ready to learn is the best possible start to the day for our children. Did you know that being even 5 minutes late per day can add up to 3.4 school days (more than 20 hours) of learning missed a year?

Parents and carers have a legal responsibility to ensure their children are receiving efficient full-time education. The expectation of the Committee for Education, Sport and Culture and one that Forest Primary School shares, is that our children achieve at least 95% attendance. Any child whose attendance falls below 90%, for whatever reason, including sickness absence and holidays, therefore becomes a serious cause for concern as this will constitute at least 20 days of absence across a full school year.
